7-Eleven M'sia stores to have energy-efficient lighting

PETALING JAYA: 7-Eleven Malaysia Holdings Bhd will begin a RM7.12 million stores lighting retrofit project with General Electric (GE) Malaysia's lighting division to retrofit more than 1,700 7-Eleven stores across the country with the energy-efficient LED lamps and fixtures.

The group said the new range of lighting provided by GE complements its next generation concept stores as well as enhancing its existing stores.
